Checklist: First steps in Jena

Here you will find important information for your first days in Jena.

□ Looking for accommodation

There's more information about accommodation in the document "Checklist Housing"

□ Registration at the Citizens Service

When you move to Jena, you have to register your address **within two weeks** with the <u>Citizen Service</u> (Bürgerservice). You will receive an official confirmation of registration (Meldebescheinigung).

Following registration, you will automatically receive a <u>tax identification number</u> (tax ID; Steuer-ID) by post for all newly registered persons (including children). You will need it to apply for Child Benefit or a bank account.

□ Registration at Immigration Authorities

You must apply for a residence permit at the <u>Immigration Authority</u> at least four to six weeks before your visa expires. In order to shorten waiting times for appointments and residence permits, all applications are checked without a personal interview. It is therefore no longer necessary to book a personal appointment. Please send the relevant application forms and all necessary documents electronically by e-mail to: <u>antrag-abh@jena.de</u>.

□ Bank account

If you want to stay longer in Germany, you need to open a German current account.

□ Family – Applying for Child Benefit

If you have children, you might be entitled to Child Benefit (Kindergeld).

□ Health insurance

Everyone who lives in Germany must have a health insurance.

□ Recommended supplementary insurance

We recommend the following supplementary insurances:

- Personal liability insurance
- Household contents insurance

□ Power supply

Every flat in the city of Jena is automatically supplied with electricity and gas by <u>Stadtwerke Jena-Pößneck</u>. Initially, every flat is in the basic tariff ("Grundversorgungstarif"). You can change the tariff.

□ TV& radio license

The <u>TV& radio license</u> finances the programs of public broadcasting. Each household has to pay the monthly fee.

□ Mobile phone, Internet

There is a large number of <u>cell phone providers</u>. You can compare tariffs online.

□ Driver's license

If you come **from EU countries**, Lichtenstein, Norway or Iceland, your driving license is also valid in Germany.

If you bring your <u>driver's license</u> with you **from a third country**, you can drive with it for six months after your registration at the Citizen Service. After that you need a German driver's license. You can book an <u>appointment at the driver's license office</u> to have your driver's license converted into a German driver's license.
